





Bishop: Send *them* into the world in witness to your love. **People: Lord, hear our prayer.**

Bishop: Bring *them* to the fullness of your peace and glory. **People: Lord, hear our prayer.**

A period of silence follows.

Almighty God, we thank you that by the death and resurrection of your Son Jesus Christ you have overcome sin and brought us to yourself, and that by the sealing of your Holy Spirit you have bound us to your service. Renew in *these* your *servants* the covenant you have made with *them* at *their* Baptism. Send *them* forth in the power of that Spirit to perform the service you set before *them*; through Jesus Christ your Son our Lord, who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and for ever. **Amen.**

Why the Paper Mache?



You may have noticed much of the artwork I created for St. Paul's observance of Day of the Dead is paper mache. This art form originated in China in the 10th century and made its way to Japan, Persia and eventually Europe by the 17th century where the French named it Papier-Mâché, which meant chewed paper. The Jesuits brought it to Mexico in the 1600s to make church goods and they taught it to the Indigenous people whoused it to make their own artwork and decorations. Pedro Linares is credited with a resurgence of this art form during the 1968 Summer Olympics in Mexico when the world was exposed to his life size skeletal figures of athletes.

There are endless formulas for making paper mache online, but at its most simple it is a paste made from wheat flour, salt, and water which you layer with Manilla paper or newsprint to create a hard shell which can then be painted and sealed. You may have experienced making it when you were a child at home or in school. I enjoy using it because it is just plain fun, and it holds a rich and colorful history in this hemisphere where artisans have used it for decades to make objects to celebrate Day of the Dead.

Adopting that tradition for myself, I made the fruits on the banners in the Narthex and the Heart plaques in the Sanctuary from paper mache, as well as the birds, pomegranates and skull that are part of the Tree of Life sitting on top of the Baptismal Font. I hope my artwork will add to your enjoyment of this All Saints' Day and Day of the Dead and enhance your worship experience as you remember your loved ones.

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
